



Children in Need is taking place on Friday 13th November. We would like to invite the children to a non-uniform day and come dressed in spots or sports or their favourite clothes – anything goes! Public Health have asked us to remind parents and families of the need to be vigilant at all times to protect each other from coronavirus. As the number of cases is increasing across the whole of the East Riding it is vitally important that we continue to do the best we can to protect ourselves and each other. Public Health advise that the best way we can do this is to ensure we wash our hands thoroughly, maintain 2m distance between each other and wear face coverings when we are near other people. The main point of contact for parents is the queue at the beginning & end of the day. To keep everyone as safe as possible we are asking that you please

- **Keep 2m apart** from each other in the queue
- **Wear a face covering** when dropping off/picking up
- **Cross the road** to avoid other parents when walking away from KS2 gate
- **Queue to the side** of the gate to ensure the exit is free



I know many of you already follow these guidelines and we thank you for your consideration. We are doing everything we can in school to keep our community safe; by working together we stand a better chance of keeping our school and local area Covid free.



Christmas will look very different in school this year. As we have to limit and quarantine resources and costumes on a daily basis, cannot sing together as a group and cannot invite parents and grandparents into school, we will be unable to perform Nativity plays or Church services as usual. We are unable to have our PFA Christmas Fair and are unlikely to be able to post all our Christmas cards together in our post box. **However, this does not mean Christmas is cancelled.** We all love Christmas very much in school and will be looking for different ways to celebrate and make sure things like parties can still go ahead, albeit in an adapted way, to make this a special and magical time for the children (and staff). Emergency Assistance from East Riding. Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, central government have provided funding to the council to allow us to offer financial support to help households in the East Riding. Eligible applicants will have experienced a reduction in their income of at least 20% which is the result of COVID-19 and do not have savings available to afford essential items.

East Riding residents may request assistance with food and toiletries, gas and electric bills, nappies for children aged three and under, and travel costs to work or pre-booked hospital appointments.
